



Welcome to our Sexual Assault Referral Centre (SARC)

We know you could be feeling overwhelmed and may have feelings of guilt, shame and anger.

We are here to support you through any feelings you have and help you to understand this is not your fault.

Who will I meet at the SARC?

A Crisis Worker will support you throughout your time at the SARC.

You will also be looked after by a Forensic Sexual Offence Examiner who will complete your examination.

How long will it take?

You will be with us for around 4 hours.

Who will support me after visiting the SARC?

We will contact any professionals that can help support you.

This could include GP/Counselling/Mental Health/Sexual Health.

Is the service confidential?

Yes, however there may be times when we need to share information with others if we are concerned for yours or someone else's safety.

Can I bring someone with me?

You can come alone or bring someone with you.

What is a forensic examination?

This is how we obtain evidence and will explain in more detail on your arrival:

Self Referral - There is no pressure to report to Police. No information will be shared with them without your consent.

We keep forensic samples for 2 years to allow you time to decide if you wish to report.

Police Referral - You will be supported by a specially trained officer called a SOLO (Sexual Offence Liaison Officer). They will support you throughout the Police investigation.

Anonymous reporting - There is the option to share information with the Police about what happened without sharing your details. Speak to the team to find out more.
